Breath of fresh air for urgent plans of electrification and roads

Minister of Public Works offers political support for isolated communities

- Minister Javier Chaves will visit San Carlos on July 19

The Minister of Public Works and Transportation, Javier Chaves, committed himself to give all his political support and ensured that, if the MOPT has the economic resources, the inhabitants of Moravia and Chamorro, Cutris, will be able to have the necessary repairs done on the road in the short term which will also allow them to have electric energy.

Chaves welcomed today at his office a delegation from Industrias Infinito SA (a company that will contribute with 90 million colones in materials to repair the road), libertarian members of the assembly Carlos Herrera and Carlos Salazar, the municipal representative Antonio Arce and the communal leaders of Coopevega and Moravia, to whom he expressed “his wish” to collaborate with the development of these communities.

The director of public works explained that, if there are resources available for road maintenance in the budget, “a part will be taken to San Carlos’ Municipality so that they will be able to develop works”. Chaves also informed that next Friday July 19, Minister Chaves will be in Ciudad Quesada with clearer responses regarding the requests made today.

In that regard, General Manager of Industrias Infinito, Jesus Carvajal, said: “We are satisfied because our objective has always been to help those communities needing a good road and electricity” and added that he trusts that next July 19, Minister Chaves will come to San Carlos full of good news on the future of this project.

Regarding the interest of Industrias Infinito SA in the repair the 27,5 kilometers of road, the municipal representative, Antonio Arce emphasized that “all efforts made whether they come from cattle raisers, farmers, the Municipality or Industrias Infinito, are positive for the development of the Northern area”

The possibility of constructing 27,5 kilometers of road that will benefit the villages close to the Crucitas Project, was generated four months ago, when Industrias Infinito SA, IISA, promoted an agreement (signed by Bishop Angel Sancasimiro as a witness), with San Carlos Municipality.

In spite of the public offers of Major Marco Luis Camacho, the truth is that the project “hangs by a thread”, and that is the reason why IISA has taken the initiative in seeking a hearing with the Minister of Public Works, which materialized today.
